We look forward to further meetings with Mr. Bennett during the coming months to further discuss and, hopefully, bring these important projects to fruition.

The Tree Lighting Ceremony, held on December 5<sup>th</sup>, was a complete success. The weather was great and all who attended had a very enjoyable time. Thank you to those who participated and to all who attended, especially the jolly old man himself who always puts an extra sparkle in one's eye during this very special time of the year. I would like to express my sincere appreciation to the business community who continue to support the fundraising program, held in conjunction with the Tree Lighting Ceremony, to help needy families during the festive season.
